



A River of Revelation

James 1:22 (NKJV) *"But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves."*

Words of Ministry

Everything in the spiritual life depends on revelation. Just as your physical life depends on the information you acquire through your five physical senses, so your spiritual life depends on what you discern with your spirit's faculties. In the natural world, if you are blind, you are going to have a hard time in getting around. You can't see, so you don't know where to go or what to do. The same is true with you spiritually. If you have no revelation of spiritual realities, you cannot see where to go or what to do.

Revelation is spiritual "seeing". When you see spiritual things to be real, you live in the light of those realities, walk in them and apply them in your life where needed. Your inner person depends on revelation to walk in the spiritual world just as your outer person is dependent upon seeing with your physical eyes to get around.

Believers in Christ should learn to live in a river of continuous revelation in spiritual things. We not only have *a spirit of wisdom and revelation* given to us by the Lord (Eph 1:17), but we also have the Spirit of God living in us to unveil and shine light on God's word as we meditate in it. The combination of these things should lead every believer into a life of flowing in revelation knowledge.

Are you flowing in a river of revelation?

Perhaps you remember a time when every time you opened the word of God to read it, revelation just flowed to you. But maybe it seems now that the river of revelation has run dry. If that is your experience, I strongly

suggest that you backtrack to the last known revelation God gave you from His word. Go back to that and see if you acted on it, if you did what God showed you to do. Did you put that revelation into practice in your life? Did you act on God's word or just read it? If you didn't act on the revelation you received, that is probably why the river of revelation stopped flowing. Just go back to it and start again. Dig into that revelation and then put it into action in your life. You'll soon find new revelations are beginning to flow.

You see, we need to put faith into action by acting on the revelation God gives us. As James says, we need to *"be doers of the word and not hearers only"*. Revelation was never meant to be *just knowledge* to us but *truth that transforms* us from the inside out. Revelation is most prolific when you are acting on the Word and putting it into action in your daily life. The more you act on God's revealed Word, the more you will see into it and more and more light will come to you. Light comes from light.

Beloved, nothing God reveals to you is insignificant! Every revelation comes into your life from God like a seed of potential. The more you work with it, plant it, act on it, water it... it will grow up and expand and fill your life with incredible spiritual fruit. What God reveals to you may seem insignificant at first in light of the problems you are facing. What He reveals may not even make good sense to your natural mind. But act on what God reveals anyway! If you had insight into the spirit realm, you would see they're far more important than you think.

Beloved, God wants your inner person to live in a continuous river of revelation. He wants to fully enlighten and fill your inner spirit with His light so you know in your soul what things to think on, what things to act on and what things to feel. Revelation acted upon will always cause spiritual growth, transformation and lead your soul into deeper and deeper union with Christ!

So open God's Word anew today. Come before Him expecting a fresh revelation of the Scripture and commit to Him to follow it up with obedience. Be a doer of God's revelations and not a hearer only and your river will never run dry.
